WESTBROOK'S NEWEST PARK AND WETLANDS ON TRACK TO OPEN THIS SPRING



Westbrook residents will also be pleased to know that the new park and wetlands planned for in Stage 55 are both on track to open in late Spring this year.

Covering over three quarters of a hectare, the new park will feature a wide range of sensory and active play elements catering for children of all ages from toddlers through to teens including swings with baby seats, musical stepping stones, a scooter track, and an outdoor lounge and chill out area. There's even a nature play area incorporating balancing logs, timber steppers and cluster climbers.

Forming the park's key centrepiece, the KOMPAN Stegosaurus play structure is expected to be one of the park's most recognisable – and popular, attractions. Providing a range of play value and tests motor skills for all abilities, climbers will also be rewarded with amazing view of the surrounding area and nearby Skeleton Creek.

But it's not just about the kids! Fitness enthusiasts will also enjoy various outdoor equipment located along the shared pedestrian path, plus there's an undercover shelter and a quiet seating area away from play areas for those after a little meditative time.

A variety of local shrubs, ground covers and aquatic plants will provide an attractive backdrop for the adjacent wetlands and nearby Skeleton Creek, with native trees forming shaded canopies along the pedestrian and shared paths.

Best of all, solar public lighting will be introduced as part of Council's overall strategy, which will enhance the usability of the park and the path network after dark at night and in terms of safety.



It's time to recognise another successful Westbrook Community Fund grant applicant.

Celebrating its first anniversary last November, Truganina Tennis Club was established by a small group of local tennis enthusiasts to provide coaching and playing opportunities for children in the western region, with a particular focus on Truganina and neighbouring suburbs.

Located on Alcock Road, Truganina, the Club's facilities include six hard courts with lights, four of which are available for the exclusive use of members, plus another two which are also open to the general public. It also has access to shared clubhouse facilities, which includes a kitchen and a shared club room and change rooms.

Over the past year, membership has continued to grow and currently encompasses players of every age from 4-year-olds to older adults, all eager to stay fit – and have fun while doing so. The Club is also affiliated with Tennis Australia, partnering with coach Patrick Henson and his HIT team, who offer coaching for players of all abilities. As well as social competitions, Truganina Tennis Club now fields eight teams, each made up of four junior players, who regularly represent the Club in WRTA tournaments.



The Club's initial success comes as no surprise to Club President, Nandu Chandran, and Club Vice President, Adnan Mir. Says Chandran, "I think people are definitely attracted to the upside of being involved in a community-based sporting organisation like ours, from the obvious health benefits through to the opportunity to make new friendships with people who have a shared passion for the sport!

Plus, we offer a great range of programs including our popular Social Tennis initiative, daily coaching classes for both kids and adults; free-for-all Open Days; and a full calendar of weekday social events for both juniors and adults, ongoing junior competitions and we're also in the process of rolling out our first Annual Truganina Tennis Club-Open

competition for adults later this year – which ensures we can appeal to a wide cross section of people within the community." Mir says the Westbrook Community Fund grant has arrived at a crucial time for the Club, and will fund the acquisition of essential infrastructure, particularly windbreakers. which offer crucial protection from wind and sun, improving playing conditions and visibility while providing relief from extreme weather.

For the past few months we've followed the journey of Gurjit Dhillon and his family who purchased land at Westbrook. We caught up with him recently, now he has finally moved into his new house, to see how he and his family are settling in.

When did you and your family move into your home at Westbrook?

"We finally collected the keys in October 2023 – and it was well worth the wait! We are totally loving our new home!"

Describe your home?

"Our house was built by Aston Homes and is 22.5 squares. We really love the design – and the amount of space it provides. We now have four bedrooms, two living areas and even a walk-in pantry, which is great for a growing family. High ceilings and doors have also helped create the overall sense of spaciousness."

Any tips for anyone thinking about building their own home?

"First and foremost, it's important for anyone planning on building their own home to take the time to plan and research all the different aspects involved, starting with where you want to live and what is going to be possible and achievable within your budget. You also need to think hard at the outset about what design and layout will best suit your needs and lifestyle, and what features, fixtures and fittings you really want down the track.

"Why? Because it's really hard to change course, especially on bigger things, once your build is underway – not to mention expensive!

"Just as important, I also recommend establishing and maintaining good communications with your builder and pro-actively checking in with them regularly throughout the build. Given that building your own home is one of the biggest investments you're ever likely to make, communication and accessibility with the person bringing your dreams to life is critical. So, don't be afraid to call them and get them to update you on progress, where things are at etc."

What's it like now you are in?

"One word – happy! Now that we're in, I feel as though we have now really begun a new and exciting stage of our lives."

What's the best thing about living at Westbrook?

"Living in Westbrook has been great so far. It is just fantastic having every facility and amenity we could possibly need, all right on our doorstep from great new schools to parks and playgrounds to shops and service stations. The pace of construction in the Estate has continued to move along really quickly, and it's amazing to see the number of completed houses expanding almost literally before our eyes."



TARNEIT PARK HUB WELCOMES WELCOMES MORE NEW RETAILERS

Early Learning childcare facility are all expected to open their doors, while the eagerly anticipated launch of Club Tarneit is scheduled for April.

Undoubtedly, the commercial and retail offerings at the Hub benefit the whole community and are set to attract even more people to one of Western Melbourne's fastest growing areas.

"Essentially my days comprise plenty of phone calls and emails, reviewing spreadsheets and attending meetings, with the ultimate goal of providing the best outcome for the project with the support of the wider team – both internal and external. I'm responsible for making sure all the moving parts come together as and when they should – and I love it!"

What is the best - and worst, thing about your role? "On the plus side, I am a people person at heart, and I really enjoy working with a great team of people every day across myriad different roles.



The consistently dynamic nature of my role also means that there's something new happening most days which keeps me invigorated and on my toes. The worst thing is undoubtedly having to read and respond to so many emails! While I know they're an essential communication channel for most of us, the sheer barrage of emails that people send can sometimes feel relentless – and sending an email definitely lacks the personal touch of a call."

Who will Westbrook most appeal to?

"The beauty of Westbrook lies in the depth and variety of product offerings and surrounding amenity, which makes it so attractive to such a wide demographic of purchasers – everyone from first home owners, through to investors and downsizers
