Westbrook's Southern Precinct parks

In good news for lovers of the great outdoors, construction on the two eagerly awares borks in Westbrook's Southern Precinct are rearing completion, with both opening to the numbersoon.



The two new open spaces, on Latitude Promerade and Pichic Street, have been designe with readents of all ages and physical abilities in mind. Between them they feature over 200 mature trees complemented by extensive plantings of native shrubs, delivering two unear re-mailtonal seases guarantized to appeal to Westbrook's growing community.

Located just off Leakes Roed, on the corner of Latitude Promenade and Society Boulevard in Stage I, the Central Reserve is spread over two acras. Locking out over Forsyth Waterway and offering up pictures que views of Melbourne's city skyline in the distance, the park features sheltered seating, 880 facilities, free WiFi, a children's play type, a scooter track and how and a large kinkabout space.

The smaller Picklet Park can be found on the corner of Montmarte Drive and Picnic Street in Stage 2 of the development. As with the Central Reserve, if the fund of designed shelter and planty of fun play equipment for kids, free Vitte, with the smaller more intimate setting expected to appeal to families with young children.

Leakes Road duplication on the way

Westbrook residents are set to benefit from major upgrades to Leakes Road with essential road duplication works about to commence

Funning the full length of Westbrook's Southern Precinct, Lesker Road is one of Truganina's key thoroughfares, carrying an estimated 23,000 cars each of the roadworks will see the current dust carriageway widefied to two laries in each direction, significantly increasing Leakes Road's capacity and delivering locals with reduced travel times, more efficient traffic flows and greater connectivity with surrounding areas.

Contractors engaged by Dennis Family Corporation will carry out construction of the initial 1.5 km stridch of new road between Skeleton Creek and Alcock Roa. directly adjacent to Westbrook, with completion of the works expected to take around 20 months. VicRoads will also begin duplication works to the remaining sections of Leakes Road, between Derminut Road and the Princes Freeway, late this year.

Other important projects about to get underway at Westbrook in coming months include the relocation of overtead power lines underground along Alcock Road and to the north, the upgrade of the Diohertyn Road and Mornis Road interrection is well underway and is expected to be completed in the coming months.
